Numerous donations have been received from Units and members as well. The donation line added to the expense report forms has proved to be very successful and we truly appreciated each and every one. In the future these donations, specific to a program or line item, will show in the Budget to Actual as a negative in the appropriate accounts until the money is used.

We have also received two \$500 and one \$1000 grant from Walmart that will be used for training. And thank you to those people who spent the time to get those grants.

We have been working on distribution of past “president project funds”

Krisann Owens, \$3743.85 to be distributed @ \$2743.85 to go to National President’s visit, \$1000 for Distinguished Guest Chairman so that she has a budget to work with while the National President is here.

Gea Clausier, \$683 was distributed to a veteran and her children that was referred to us by our Service Officer. That was a female Veteran helping a female Veteran.

Kathi Karnowski, \$5965.92 total with \$2982.96 to Veteran’s Legacy Camp and \$2982.96 to Divide Camp

We are happy that we were able to go back and take care of those funds and get them moved.

National Executive Committeeperson, Krisann Owens

National President Kathy Daudistel’s theme: “Honoring Tradition, Value Every Voice”

The ALA 100th National Convention was held in Phoenix, Arizona, August 28 to September2, 2021. Yes, it was hot and for the first time, no parade. COVID precautions were in effect, but we had the option of using a mask or not. We did have to wear a mask on the bus IF the bus driver was wearing one.

It was amazing to see our fellow members and get those visits in that we've missed. There were hugs and a general vibe of happiness.

The unfortunate news during the pre-convention meeting was that 36 Departments had a total of 157 Charters cancelled. There were 9 new Charters granted since the February 2021 NEC meeting with 4 Charters being reinstated. As of February 2021, we had 7,937 active Units and as of August 2021, we have a total of 7,793 active Units.

Some statistics given were that only 60% of membership covers National's expenses, ALA National received a PPL loan and it is in the process of being forgiven by the government, so repayment is not required.

Donations received by the National Organization are 81% from members and 19% from people who believe in the mission.

Special Committee, Inclusion & Diversity has been renamed Equality, Inclusion & Diversity.

While reviewing documents, it was discovered that the Articles of Incorporation have not been reviewed since 1934. This is a priority to get updated.

We will also be addressing our policies, at the National level, for review.

There will be more online training and technical information coming soon, including Diversity, Equality, and Inclusion training.

A new marketing plan is being developed.

National wants to give us the opportunity to measure our success. This is important as the past two years have found most of our units floundering and some are still not meeting or working programs. We need to turn this around.

If you hold an Executive Session, it is to be considered HIGHLY confidential. That means, DO NOT TALK ABOUT IT WITH ANYONE.

Duty of care: Be prepared

Duty of loyalty to ALA, to the Department

Duty of obedience-faith to our governing documents

Operations Guide is only a guide, the Big Red Book, it is not the final word

Finally, there will be a proposed dues increase presented in 2022 to go into effect 2024 if approved. No numbers have been given at this time.

Then it was off to National Convention, what a learning experience that was. I meet great people and learned what our organization does and the impact that we make to our Veterans, community and youth on a National level. There was a membership resolution introduced on the floor, it was tabled indefinitely. It was a resolution for adding all genders within two steps of relationship, so that we could have the younger boys in the Juniors. There was one member that spoke, and she said we can't have great granddaughters, so why would we want to change to add all genders. That made me stop and think about the resolution even more, because great granddaughters are important, too. I have a copy of the resolution if anyone wants to see it.

Then it was off to the PIR. We came together as a family from all over the state. We set up, manned, and tore down the booth each and every day! We met amazing Veterans and their families, signed up new members and educated the community about our programs and what we do. There were great conversations out there and we met wonderful Veterans. It was hot and it was long, but it was well worth it. And when we all loaded up in the van, at one time we had 14 or 15 people in there. And I don't fit well on people's laps. Once the van was loaded, we headed to the Aloha Post 104 for the Pit Crew dinner. What a friendly, welcome, and warm Post. And of course, when we arrived, I headed for the kitchen. And there, of course, was the Auxiliary hard at work. I need to thank 104 right now, you guys stepped up and took on this DEC and to perform the way that you have, it shows your dedication and your passion for who we are, and what we stand for. So, thank you immensely.

I signed my first Charter for a new Unit. I signed the Charter for Williams, Unit 50. They have 18 Charter members and 4 new Juniors. I can't wait to get the Charter back and present it to them.

The Nation President, Kathy Daudistel, will be visiting our great state May 16-18, 2022. We are working on that plan now. She focuses a lot on caregiving. When Kathy spoke at National Convention, it made me stop and think, there is a caregiver in each and every one of us. I didn't realize how much caregiving I did until I heard her speech. She is incredible and very down to earth, very personable. It will be a fabulous visit.

For membership goals this year we just increased 2, one for National and one for Department, from your ending number last year. Some didn't change. Department goal for 2022 is 4159, last year it was 4488. That is 329 members that we are planning to lose. Not planning but projected to lose. To me, that is way

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too many. So please reach out to your Units that aren't performing. If you need help reach out to PDPs, get what you need from them.

We talked about the Book of Reports yesterday in our Round Table, and thank you from all my District Presidents, there was only one District that we didn't get a report. We do good work, but it needs to be recorded in the Book of Reports. You took the roll and accepted it let's continue to make sure that it happens. Do your work. When we come together, it gives me that uplift that we need just to know that we are all here together and we're in the same boat. So please, chairman, do your job.

I had a few calls when I got here asking about the time of the meeting. You all received the official call to DEC, do we read those? Do we remember?

I want to talk about the chain of command. If someone calls me, I help. I don't think that you should call your District President, or Jody Marsh, Linda, or Helen, I just help. Reach out to your District President if you are a Unit member before you reach out to me. I am going to tell you that you need to contact your District President. If you say yes, I will run with you and help you fix whatever it is. We all need to know what is going on. So please follow the chain of command.

I received a plaque at National Convention. It is for Unit Member of the Year for 2021 and it goes to Barb Pawlik, Unit 83.

Maggie LaMont, District 6 President, did our resolution about great granddaughters make it to National Convention?

President Debra, we were told before National Convention that it would not be brought up on the floor. That is why I am glad that the resolution for all genders didn't go.

National Western Division Community Service Chairman, Gea Clausier

The National President, Kathy Daudistel, wanted to state that Community Service means taking care of people, not just Veterans, but all people. If you go on alaforveterans.org website, there is a certificate that you can print out to give to anybody and everybody in your Unit that helps somebody. If you know of a youth in your neighborhood, your children or your grandchildren that are helping a neighbor, especially in this time of COVID and you just want to show them appreciation, you can give them a certificate. The certificate is a way for everyone to show appreciation. At the end of the year each Unit is going to select one person to forward to the District, the District will then choose one to send to Department and then Department will pick one which will be forwarded to me, as Western Division, then I will choose one to send to National. The certificate will have the Auxiliary name on it, so even if the person you give it to is not an Auxiliary member it will get our name out. When you present the certificate, take a picture of the presentation, and post it to the Community Service Facebook page, [alacommunityservice](https://www.facebook.com/alacommunityservice).

We will not have to do mid-year reports as long as we are posting to Facebook. That is what National wants to do this year, eliminate the reports and they want real time pictures. The posting will let other people know what you are doing and maybe they will want to try what you have done. It will end up snowballing, and that is what we are hoping for.

Because I am the Western Division Community Service chairman, I want Oregon to just blast that page. Let everyone know that we are here. The more you post the better Oregon looks.

It is not too late to post pictures of things that you did for 9/11. Don't forget that Veterans Day is coming up. Post those pictures! Just name the Unit so that everyone will know where it is coming from.

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National has done away with the program action plans. They are archived so if you feel a need to go back and look, they are there.

All of the National committees are trying to get rid of the paper and going to postings on Facebook. I am going to change hats. When I was at the Legion Fall meetings, I was talking to a man from New Mexico about grants for computers. I am going to put in a grant for computers for Posts that need them, and I would like to include the Auxiliary. So, to you District Presidents, I am asking you to find out which of your Units need a computer. I need you to let me know how many I will be asking Apple for. The stipulation is that Apple will want to train these people that are given the computer. They will be refurbished computers.

The Legion had training yesterday on Suicide Prevention, the National Commander's goal is to bring awareness to suicide by prevention. Unfortunately, the Auxiliary was not invited. I got upset and wanted to know why the Auxiliary was not invited. We need to know how to prevent suicide as well as the Legion. I now have the information so that we can have the same speaker come and speak to the Auxiliary about suicide prevention.

Geanne Horn, Department Historian, asked if the SAL could be included also.

Gea, yes.

Administrative Committee, Jody Marsh, Chairman

The Admin committee met yesterday to talk and figure out what we need to do. We have identified some issues. Our staff (Cindy Hillyard) is doing awesome, she is doing so much for us. She is annoyingly accommodating. If you call her and need something, she will stop what she is doing and do what you need. We are encouraging her to take a break, to set aside time where she doesn't answer the phone. The distractions impact the financial report, the membership processing, deposits.
